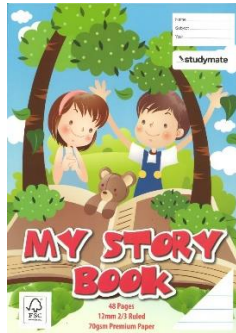


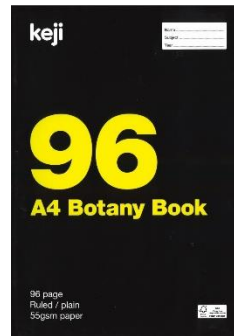
Learning at Home Starter Pack

- 1 A 4 book to be used as a learning Journal

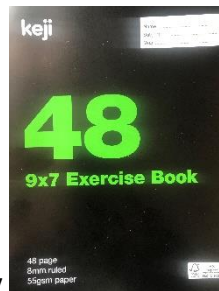

There are many simple and easy learning activities that can be undertaken at home.

Keep a journal of learning. This journal can be then shared with the teacher, (when the teacher is working online.) Undertake learning activities and record them in the journal. Be creative, many day to day home activities can become learning opportunities.

It is very important to read every day. Read all sorts of texts, cooking books stories, magazines online books There are two links to great books online included at the end of this information. Record the reading that is undertaken in your learning journal. We are registered for the Premier's Reading challenge a recording sheet will be coming home for this challenge when we receive them.

Cooking can involve a great deal of maths from measuring, counting rationing, dividing, and multiplying. Cook and look for opportunity, record learning in your learning journal.

Gardening is a wonderful opportunity to explore the science of germination and growing. Plant seeds and record daily the progress they make. Make a graph of when the seeds are watered. Plant seeds in two ways to compare growth look after one lot and neglect the other what impact does this make? Grow some seeds outside some inside some in the light some in the dark.

Behind the News is a great way to get involved in the humanities and it comes with suggestions for discussion and research. <https://www.abc.net.au/btn/classroom/> follow the teacher link for learning suggestions in relation to the latest episode. Record the work in your learning journal.

Look carefully at the wildlife that is in your yard. Birds, insects and what else? Use the journal to record what you see. Are these visitors endemic, native or are they introduced to Tasmania? Why are they in your backyard? What attracts them there?

Find out what an elderly person you know did when they were at home as a child? They did not have TV or the internet try it out if it is safe to do so. Record this in your journal.

Investigate the weather, study the clouds draw and describe the clouds you see. What happens when these clouds occur? Record the temperature and graph it at timely intervals.
